On Friday 27th July 2012 the eyes of the world will again be on London as it is estimated that more than 1 billion people around the world will tune in to the Opening Ceremony of the Olympic Games.

The person charged with dressing London as the UK's shop window for the event is Danny Boyle and, as I write this, his 'Green and Pleasant' theme seems to have caused a bit of a stir. The picture being painted for the world to look at is one of rolling hills, green meadows, rivers and streams, family picnics, village cricket, national flowers and farm animals, evoking echoes of William Blake's famous poem 'Jerusalem', which is seen as an emblem of Englishness. For some, this romantic 'Telly Tubby land' is a far cry from the reality of lengthening unemployment queues, flood damaged homes and the street riots that have become a feature of British life in recent times.

I'm not going to be a party pooper; it's appropriate to celebrate what's good and, in doing so, to let that conjure up some hope and vision for a better future.

However, it does make me wonder how often it is that the picture of ourselves that we paint for others to see simply does not match up to the reality of who we really are and all that's going on beneath the surface of our lives. We become like Hyacinth Bucket (or is that Bouquet?) who constantly wears the mask of respectability to conceal who she really is, what she's really like and where she really comes from. It's her continuous desperation not to let others find out about her true (working class) self that provides such wonderful humour. What lengths would you go to, to hide from who you really are? What would you not like displayed in the 'shop window' of your life?

It doesn't have to be like this; we don't have to pretend. We have a God who knows the very worst about us and who loves us just the same. He sent His son to be 'the friend of sinners' and to give us the freedom to be ourselves. He accepts us just as we are and, because He loves us, enables us to become more like the person he made us to be.

So, stop pretending and enjoy the Olympics!!
