A thought from Adrian

Avenging Guilt

The new Avengers movie is great fun - I've been excited about it. It's a fascinating mix of mythological gods, superheroes and 'ordinary' humans. The clash of these cultures raises some interesting questions:

- the nature of God with Captain America uttering the classic line to Loki, who thinks of himself as a god and sometimes wears a helmet with elaborate horns and a cape, "There's only one God, and I'm sure He doesn't dress like that!"
- the nature of worship with Loki saying that humans are weak because they need to worship something (Though of course that's only a sign of weakness if what we're worshipping is not worthy of worship, or not in fact true...)
- the nature of guilt with the Black Widow admitting that she may have superhero powers but still can't atone for the harm she's caused in the past. She wants to pay for her bad deeds and put it right but is taunted by the reality that she can never achieve that on her own.

The movie is a classic escapist jaunt but underlying it are some questions about our need of a rescuer who is perfect in goodness and power, can atone for our wrong, can be trusted for eternal life and is worthy of our devotion.

"...all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, through the shedding of his blood – to be received by faith." - Romans 3:23-25

Shotesham Common

The Parish Council elects four Trustees to Shotesham Common, these are currently Mrs.Bernie Fenn, Mr Bob Harris, Mr. Ed Howard and Mr. Andy Musgrove.

In agreement with Natural England, the Trustees have been utilising the earlier fine weather to have the grasses, [especially the encroaching rush grass] trimmed in the hope that this treatment may weaken it and make it more suitable to the cattle. Last year, with similar spring weather, we found that the grasses were knocked back by the treatment and we had many more wild orchids. The Church end of the common will again be grazed by Red Poll cattle in 2012.

Shotesham Parish Council Chairman's Report for 2011

The past year was a very busy time for the Parish Council, and I would like to thank all Councillors and particularly our Clerk for their positive support, help, and guidance. In addition thank all those who have supported the parish by helping with the litter picks, grass mowing, and our two Tree Wardens who keep a wary eye on the protection of our trees and environment. They are our link with the District Council. The work at St Martins demonstrates what we are capable of when we pool our resources. There are many others who take responsibility for keeping our parish

special. They know who they are – my thanks to you all.

Meetings During the year there were 12 Parish Council Meetings: 6 full meetings and 6 planning meetings. The average councillor attendance at the full meetings was 81%. Councillors also attended meetings run by South Norfolk Council, and other similar bodies. Several councillors attended training courses on planning criteria, budgets etc.

Once again there were insufficient candidates to fill all the posts and during the year Jan Jeeves, Henry Walker, and Tully Wakeman were coopted to the Council. Unfortunately Tully had to withdraw due to pressures of work, and I am pleased to report that this vacancy has been filled by Mrs Beryl Sims.

Thanks are due to our South Norfolk Councillor, Florence Ellis, and our County Councillor Allison Thomas, for their very active support and help, and their valuable updates which have kept the Council well informed.

Planning During the year 12 planning applications were considered, 11 accepted and one rejected. Members of the public attended only three meetings, the total number attending was a disappointing 6. The Parish Council works for the village and it would be constructive if more would take an interest on what is going on.

Applications of major interest;

- 1. TCI Renewables has announced that it will make an application for four wind turbines, around Hempnall, instead of the original seven by Enertrag. These will be staller than the previous units, TCI Renewables states they have reduced the number to comply with the Inspector's comments. We expect the application sometime in 2012. The four new turbines may be sited just outside our parish boundaries, but there still is the question of intrusion.
- 2. Also there was an application for an ECO home to be constructed and contained within the hillside of the Common, we await developments.

Finance. The precept this year rose to its normal figure following the reimbursement of unspent precept last year for the War Memorial. The figure was £5083.00. The bank balance at the end of the year was £9397.53

The assets of the parish are approximately £23,000.00 with about £20,000.00 allowed for the war memorial. The rest includes seats, sign, notice boards, dog bins and the computer equipment operated by the Clerk. **Playing Field** I have to report that despite protracted discussions the landlord

[Kidner Farming Ltd] has declined all our proposals to improve the parking and tenancy of the field. It was also hoped that the parish could purchase the land but this has not been possible. However, it has been confirmed that the existing agreement will continue and that the Parish Council will retain the existing tenancy on the original terms.

The field continues to be enjoyed, by three football teams - the under 7's, under 8's, and under 9's under the title of Stoke United Football Club. All three teams have done well in their leagues. The field provides an essential facility for them, and is the only such area available to our parish. It also provides a base for many other village activities and fetes run by the Village Association.

We have received several reports that dog fouling on the field is a continuing problem. Please bag dog faeces and remove it. We have provided dog bins so please use them.

<u>Pride of Norfolk Competition.</u> I am pleased to report that Shotesham came a close second in the under 1000 population class, the next bracket up from the smallest which we only just exceeded, so we were competing in the next grade. We did particularly well thanks to Jan Jeeves who put the exhibition together and co-ordinated the judges visit. We received our certificate on the 23rd November 2011 at County Hall and had a mention in the Eastern Daily Press.

<u>Village Questionnaire</u> It was agreed to carry out a village questionnaire to establish what residents felt was enjoyed or needed, so that the Parish Council could accurately represent their views.

Jan Jeeves took on the mantle and I am delighted to report that there was a response of over 60%. This must be one of the best responses for such a questionnaire. Copies of the report have been circulated to all homes and we are looking for an interesting discussion after the Annual Meeting to night.

<u>Village Litter Pick</u> Thanks to Heather Jackson for organising the litter picks again this year. Litter is becoming a problem in the village and the amount collected this time was up on the last. If you see litter on or about your property please pick it up as litter begets more litter.

I would like to thank all the volunteers who were involved in this necessary work, although more volunteers would make the job easier.

Neighbourhood Watch Scheme I am pleased to report that communications with the police have much improved. We have had two visits at Parish Council meetings by local officers, and there is a marked increase in the presence factor of police in the village. One alarming trend is the increase in reported crimes here. There is no simple solution exceptlock everything up particularly oil tanks and sheds.

Highways and Verges Over the past year Highways have speedily responded to all our concerns, in fact the service has been exceptionally high. It is appreciated that some road surfaces are below par, but their non repair is a sign of the financial situation. We are still having discussions with NCC regarding the gritting of Shotesham Hill during the winter period. There are significant safety matters and we have the full support of our County Councillor.

<u>Telephone Boxes</u> As you know the B.T. boxes are now owned by the Parish Council. After much discussion, when the costs of renovation were finally established, and consultation with local residents it was decided not to renovate the box in The Grove. It has been vandalised and it is the intention to remove it after some parts have been taken to restore the box on The Common. The Common box will be equipped with shelves etc. as a village information centre. Tenders have been issued to establish the costs actually expected.

<u>Dog Bins</u> We now have three dog bins in the village. The Council pays £200 annually to SNDC to have these bins cleared regularly, so please use them.

Web Page The Council has been concerned for some time that communications in the village leave much to be desired. As a result the Parish Council will fund for a trial period the running of a more active village web page. We need a forum so that all the groups and associations can inform residents of what is going on. Henry Walker and Tom Higgin have agreed to input the information.
